We live in a part of the world where winters can be very, very long. I moved to the Marquette area in March 2008 from Texas. On April 1, we had two feet of snow, and we lost power for several hours! Gisele and I knew we weren't in Amarillo anymore!

I like snow, but I'm impatient when April arrives, and we really can't declare the arrival of spring. I was introduced to the term "mud season". Will there ever be blooming flowers again? Will I ever be able to plant my tomatoes? We were warned about not planting too early here in Zone 4.

We can be concerned about that tree we transplanted in the fall. We can be concerned about those flower bulbs surviving a cold winter. We can be concerned about the young and vulnerable wildlife surviving a hard winter. We are tempted to lose hope when he cold dreariness of life lingers. We can be concerned about the state of our congregation or about violent conflicts in our world. The list of concerns goes on...

It is tempting to feel overwhelmed in the long wintry night of the soul. We can be tempted to feel as if there is no purpose in our actions. It is during such times that we do well to consider the promises of God. Jesus told a parable of the kingdom about a seed growing in secret. "The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how." Mark 4:26-27

Imagine that. Something is beyond my human control and full understanding! We as humans so much want to be in control and understand. We like to be our own boss, to set our own agendas, to be in control of our emotions, to chart the course, to apply ourselves to the goal and to methodically achieve that goal. Jesus never said that the chief end of human beings is to be in total control of their lives.

But even with that perspective of not being in control, we are not to be mere passive bystanders in the destinies of life either. Paul wrote to the church in Corinth, "I planted, Apollos watered it, but God gave the growth." (I Corinthians 3:6)

Our job in the Kingdom is not about guaranteeing results. The growth, the harvest, the end result, is God's business. But neither do we just throw up our hands and say, "I have no role is this." No, we are unavoidably in the business of scattering seed.

Yes, even in the dreariness of a long winter, the gardeners in us aremaking plans for spring. We may even have some starter plants growing in our homes during winter. Come spring, we will transplant them into our outdoor gardens.

Though are hearts are wintry and grieving, the touch of God can revive. The touch of God's Spirit can remind us to keep on planting, planning, hoping, and sowing seeds in a world that doesn't believe growth can possibly happen under two feet of snow!

~Nineteen voting members present as Council Vice President Sarah Kimball called the meeting to order.

~Pastor Lloyd thanked the current Eucharistic Ministers for their help in taking Communion to our homebound members. Pastor invited others to become Eucharistic Ministers too. He thanked many members for the ongoing work they do at Emanuel. He noted the church has increased in the number of people joining us for Sunday worship services.

~ Emanuel continues to be a busy church throughout the year, as the reviews of the Christian Education, Worship and Music, Outreach, Stewardship, Youth Mission and Cemetery board Committee reports were shared.

~ The Audet Committee report is coming soon. Both the Financial Secretary and Treasurer reports were reviewed and accepted.

~Although our Accessibility Ramp to the Sanctuary project is on hold, we are waiting for an estimate for the cost of the ramp from a contractor Roger Kimball has met with recently.

~The 2025 Budget was reviewed line by line and adopted.

Thank you to Sarah Kimball & Leah Kainulainen for remaining on the Council for another term when their current term expired in December of 2024. Sarah Kimball and Richard Cooke will be the two Synod Assembly Voting Delegates in May of 2025. Two Extra Synod Conference 8 Delegates are still needed. Nominating Committee is Barb Bach Ronda Barr, and Christie Johnson. Auditing Committee will likely remain the same. Fortune Lake Annual Meeting representatives are Sarah Kimball and Jane Sims.
